

Minutes from the Roxbury Selectmen's meeting April 18, 2016

In attendance: Selectmen Gerry Davis, Tim O'Brien and Jim Rousmaniere; Police Chief Rob O'Connor; citizen Chip Drogue; Road Agent Ken Buffum

The meeting opened at 7 p.m. Minutes from the meeting of April 11 were approved as written.

The Selectmen approved permits for special events to be held at Granite Gorge on May 15 and May 21; the events are subject to the terms and standards of the new special events policy.

The Selectmen discussed a voter-approved renovation of the kitchen facilities in town hall. Two bids have been filed; a third bid will be sought to satisfy the town's bidding policy.

The Selectmen discussed plans for a community cemetery clean-up scheduled for April 30. The discussion focused principally on whether trees should be cut.

Police Chief O'Connor reported that the use of a loaned speed indicator on Branch Road had ended. He reported that he will provide a report of the month-long experience once speed and traffic volume data are in hand.

Selectmen O'Brien processed two timber cut tax forms which are now computed online.

There was discussion about asking the Monadnock School District for the names of enrolled students from Roxbury to confirm that the district's information conforms to records maintained by Town Clerk Robin Buffum.

Selectman Gerry Davis completed the manifest, which was signed by selectmen.

It was agreed that a new investment policy drafted by Treasurer David Jewett would be circulated among appropriate town officials, after which a copy of the policy will be sent to the trust division of the NH Attorney General's Office.

It was agreed that selectman Rousmaniere will check with Amy Bodwell regarding her thoughts about the next steps for the yet-to-be empanelled town conservation commission.

The meeting adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
